# **ORDINANCE 19-19C**

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING AN ORDINANCE ENTITLED, "CODE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF LONG BEACH, COUNTY OF OCEAN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY (1997)," AS THE SAME IN CHAPTER 68 PERTAINING TO THE STORAGE OF BUILDING MATERIALS

THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE TOWNSHIP OF LONG BEACH DOES ORDAIN:

#### **STATEMENT OF PURPOSE**

This Ordinance amends Chapter 68 to revise the regulations governing litter, debris, trash, and refuse at construction and demolition sites.

# **SECTION I**

§68-1B is repealed and replaced as follows.

- B. It shall be unlawful for any owner, agent, or contractor in charge of any construction or demolition site to permit the accumulation of litter, construction debris, demolition debris, trash, and/or refuse before, during, or after the completion of any construction or demolition project. It shall be the responsibility of the owner, agent, and contractor to provide a sufficient number of containers adequate to accommodate all litter, debris, trash, and refuse at the site and maintain and empty the containers with sufficient frequency to prevent any spillage of litter, debris, trash, and/or refuse.
  - 1. All litter, construction debris, demolition debris, trash, and refuse shall be cleared and removed from the construction or demolition site within seventy-two (72) hours following the demolition or construction at a site.

### **SECTION II**

All ordinances, or parts of ordinances, inconsistent with this ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.

#### **SECTION III**

If any word, phrase, clause, section, or provision of this ordinance shall be found by any Court of competent jurisdiction to be unenforceable, illegal, or unconstitutional, such word, phrase, clause, section, or provision shall be severable from the balance of the ordinance and the remainder of the ordinance shall remain in full force and effect. **Effective date.** 

This ordinance shall take effect after final adoption and publication as required by law.

RESOLUTION OF THE TOWNSHIP OF LONG BEACH, COUNTY OF OCEAN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY SUPPORTING THE LAWSUIT BY THE OCEAN COUNTY BOARD OF FREEHOLDERS, CHALLENGING THE ATTORNEY GENERAL'S IMMIGRATION TRUST DIRECTIVE

**WHEREAS**, Attorney General Gurbir S. Grewal issued the 'Immigration Trust Directive' ("Directive") last November, 2018, which went into effect in March, 2019 statewide; and

**WHEREAS**, under the Directive, Local, County and State law enforcement personnel are ordered not to stop, search or detain immigrants at the request of U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE), except in cases of serious or violent crimes, or final deportation orders; and

**WHEREAS**, the Directive has led to increased concerns by governmental entities and police forces due to the lack of information sharing and cooperation with ICE: and

**WHEREAS**, the Ocean County Board of Chosen Freeholders ("Board") has announced its intention to file a lawsuit to challenge the legality of the Directive in Federal Court, as the Board does not agree with the Directive; and

**WHEREAS**, several local Ocean County departments, such as the Ocean County Jail, have continued to provide information to ICE, despite the Directive, leaving them susceptible to reprimand from the State; and

**WHEREAS**, the Township wishes to authorize its Police Department to continue cooperating and sharing information with ICE but will refrain from ordering the department to disobey the Directive, in fear that such individuals would be subject to retaliation; and

**WHEREAS**, the Governing Body supports the Board and its decision to fight the Directive and further believe that this course of action is the most proper, as it will insulate its employees from retaliation; and

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED,** by the governing body of the Township of Long Beach, County of Ocean, State of New Jersey, as follows:

- I. That the Governing Body supports the Ocean County Board of Chosen Freeholders' decision to tile a lawsuit to challenge the legality of the Directive; and

**WHEREAS**, according to NJSA 54:4-66.3, it is necessary to give property owners 25 days from the mailing date of the tax bills for payment of the 3<sup>rd</sup> quarter taxes; and

**WHEREAS**, it will be necessary for the Governing Body of the Township of Long Beach to grant an extension of the due date for the payment of third quarter taxes to August  $16^{th}$ , 2019.

**Administrator's Report: Mr. Ominski** invited the public to attend National Night Out on Tuesday, August 6<sup>th</sup> in Bayview Park. Fireworks would be a part of the scheduled activities for this annual event.

# **COMMISSIONERS' REPORTS**

**Commissioner Lattanzi** noted Firepit Fridays have been very successful and well attended. Trolley and gator ridership had increased over 2018. The Township school tax burden (So. Regional School District) had increased by 2 million dollars over the 2018 rate

**Commissioner Bayard** announced Hazardous Waste Drop Off Day was scheduled for September  $7^{th}$  at the Public Works Garage at 7910 Long Beach Blvd. from 9:00am to 3:00pm.

**Mayor Mancini** announced the next meeting of the Land Use Board would be held on Wednesday, August 14<sup>th</sup> at 7:00 pm in the upstairs multi-purpose room. Second Reading and Public Hearing for Ordinances 19-20 and 21C would take place at the public meeting held on September 9<sup>th</sup> at 4:00 pm. The Mayor reminded pedestrians that jaywalkers would be ticketed, and that bikers, walkers and joggers must observe the law and yield to traffic appropriately.

# **OPEN PUBLIC SESSION**

**Janet Drew/Brant Beach** continued to express her concern with the proposed construction of a new hotel in Beach Haven. She felt the traffic from the hotel would negatively impact traffic in Long Beach Township.

**Mayor Mancini** reminded her that the matter could only be discussed in Beach Haven Borough; Long Beach Township could not intervene in another municipality's decision(s).

Carolyn McCarthy/Peahala Park and John Prout/Brant Beach were concerned with Boulevard traffic at the intersection of 90<sup>th</sup> Street. They felt an additional traffic light was needed in order for pedestrians to safely cross the Boulevard. **Ms. McCarthy** had contacted the Ocean County Engineer with her request. **John Prout** was also thankful to the police officers who had recently responded to a first aid call at his home.

Tom Mignanelli/Brant Beach, Mary Coughlin/Brant Beach, and Richard Knors/Brant Beach expressed their concern and dissatisfaction with the appearance of the Brant

Beach Water Treatment Plant currently being constructed. They requested fencing and landscaping be installed immediately as the original timeframe had been exceeded. They were unhappy with the appearance of the Plant and felt residents should have been contacted/notified concerning the final plans for the structure. Noise from the aerator at the plant was excessive. **Ms. Coughlin** felt the plant should have been constructed in an alternate location and that an impact study should have been done regarding property values in the area adjacent to the plant.

**Commissioner Bayard** stated the final plant appearance had been changed from the original design. FEMA had set many of the standards the Township Engineer was required to follow. He had received quotes for landscaping that were prohibitive in his opinion, and was waiting for fencing supplies that had been ordered to be delivered. Property owners within 200' of the plant had been notified by mail of the project, as required by law.

**Mayor Mancini** added FEMA gave the Township instructions regarding the size and construction requirements for the new plant, that must withstand a 500-year storm. Design changes/modifications were not an option for the Township.

**Joe Renner/Holgate** presented pictures of eroded beach and dune conditions near his home in the vicinity of Inlet Road and Caroline Avenue.

**Matthew Newman/Holgate** stated he needed sand on his beach access at Inlet Road. **Rand Pearsall/Holgate** asked that the dune be sculpted. He was opposed to Resolution 19-0805.01. Mr. Pearsall was grateful the Police were enforcing traffic regulations.

**Tom Beatty/Holgate** thanked the Commissioners for their attention and help with maintaining Holgate beaches. He noted the beach buggy ramp was eroded and needed care before the buggy season commenced.

**Mayor Mancini** explained pictures of the Holgate beach/dune erosion had been sent to the Army Corp of Engineers and they were aware of the situation. He felt erosion would ultimately be stemmed by the construction of a jetty. Approval for the jetty was pending from the DEP. No structures of any type were permitted on the beach or the dune. The Mayor would provide Mr. Renner contact information for the DEP so that he could speak with them directly. He also noted Beaches 1 & 2 would be groomed in October, returning them to their original profile.

**Irene Newman/Holgate** asked that two toddler swings and two regular swings be installed in Holgate Park when new equipment was ordered.

**Carol Smith/Brant Beach** thanked the Commissioners for not installing additional parking in the vicinity of the new fishing pier in Bayview Park.
