STATEMENT OF PURPOSE

This Ordinance amends Chapter 82 to revise the fees relating to water and sewer services.

- F. Industrial or any type of use not hereinabove set forth will be covered by an engineering survey and negotiations with applicant. In any installation where unusual amounts of solid matter may be injected into the sewerage collecting system, it will be mandatory for the property owner to install a solid waste trap at the entrance of the sewerage collecting system.
- G. The rents, fees, and charges prescribed above for water and sewer service shall be effective January 1, 2022, and the readings and payment due dates shall be set and paid as follows.
 - (1) The meter reading, billing, and due dates are as follows. The first Q1 shall include only the base rate and all subsequent quarters shall include the base, plus the excess rate.

- (2) Accounts shall become delinquent if unpaid 10 days after the due date(s). Interest at the rate of 1 1/2% per month (18% per annum) shall be added to accounts until fully paid. Delinquent balances shall constitute a lien against the property and are enforceable as such. The Township reserves the right to shut off water service to any property for any water bill which remains unpaid beyond 90 days.
- H. The test fee set forth in §197-15 shall be \$100.00.

SECTION II

All ordinances, or parts of ordinances, inconsistent with this ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.

SECTION III

If any word, phrase, clause, section, or provision of this ordinance shall be found by any Court of competent jurisdiction to be unenforceable, illegal, or unconstitutional, such word, phrase, clause, section, or provision shall be severable from the balance of the ordinance and the remainder of the ordinance shall remain in full force and effect.

4. Resolution 21-1220.02: Authorize Tax Appeal Officers for 2022

RESOLUTION 21-1220.02

AUTHORIZE TAX APPEAL OFFICERS FOR 2022

WHEREAS, from time to time the Tax Assessor discovers an error in calculation, transposing, measurement, or typographical errors in the tax assessments on the tax list after the time the County Board of Taxation has certified the tax rates for the tax year, or a property becomes subject to a roll-back assessment; and

WHEREAS, the governing body of the Taxing District of the Township of Long Beach is desirous that every taxpayer pays his fair share of taxes; and

WHEREAS, if the above discovered errors are not corrected or a roll-back assessment not applied, the taxpayers affected would not be paying their fair share of taxes; and

WHEREAS, the method for correcting such errors is to file a Petition of Appeal or Complaint with the Ocean County Board of Taxation; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to resolution 21-0607.03(a), Tracy A. Hafner was appointed as the Certified Tax Assessor for the Township of Long Beach with an end term of June 30, 2025 and has a current salary of One Hundred Sixteen Thousand Six Hundred Seventy-Nine Dollars (\$116,679.00); and

WHEREAS, the office of the Tax Assessor as Monday through Friday from 9:00 a.m. until 4:00 p.m.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Governing Body of the Taxing District of the Township of Long Beach that Tracy A.
