## CURBSIDE COLLECTION - Residential & Commercial

- **RECEPTACLES** Containers for trash/recycling must be no more than 32 gallons capacity weighing no more than 50 pounds when filled. The containers shall be placed no more than 5' away from the property curb line for pick up. THE LIDS MAY NOT BE TIED TO THE TRASH OR RECYCLING CONTAINERS. YOU MAY TIE THE LIDS TO THE BINS/CORRALS ONLY.

PLEASE NOTE: Trash and recycling must be put in covered containers marked specifically. Some homeowners choose blue cans for their recycling to distinguish recycling. DO NOT TIE NEWSPAPERS IN BUNDLES OR BAGS, NO FILM/WRAPS, PLASTIC BAGS OR STYROFOAM IN RECYCLING. RECYCLING IN PLASTIC BAGS WILL NOT BE PICKED UP.

### COMMERCIAL ONLY, UP TO 6 CONTAINERS IS ALLOWED FOR EACH RECYCLE AND TRASH CURBSIDE COLLECTION DAY.

- **BULK TRASH** Anything other than household garbage, such as furniture, box springs, mattresses, wood, carpet, etc., will be picked up at the property curbside by Meadowbrook Industries, NOT the Township, on your scheduled day. Toilet tanks must be separated from the base. No pilings or piling butts will be picked up with wood.

Carpet must be cut into 4' lengths and tied in bundles weighing no more than 40 pounds.

- **CLIPPINGS/YARD RAKINGS** (chips, pine needles/cones, weeds, and grass) are to be placed in plastic bags weighing no more than 40 lbs. per bag and put out along with your household trash.
- **APPLIANCES AND SCRAP METAL** items include BBQ Grills, Lawn Mowers, bicycles, etc... Please remove doors on large appliances for safety reasons. Call 609-361-6676 or email stindall@longbeachtownship.com. WE CANNOT TAKE PROPANE TANKS - they are accepted at household hazardous waste day or at a local gas station with a propane exchange program, or at Home Depot or Lowe's.
- **ELECTRONICS** Pick up only for Long Beach Township Residents. Residents can call or email stindall@longbeachtownship.com for the following electronics only: Computers, TV's, Monitors, Laptops, Printers & Fax Machines. Long Beach residents can also drop off electronics at 7910 Long Beach Blvd., Beach Haven Crest or at the Southern Ocean County Facility in Manahawkin.
- **BRANCHES** Branches will be picked up every Wednesday by MEADOWBROOK INDUSTRIES, but MUST be scheduled by calling **Township Trash & Recycling by noon on Tuesday**. All branches (tree limbs, branches) are recyclable and MUST be tied in 4' bundles weighing no more than 40 pounds. Diameter of limbs should be no more than 3 1/2". Branches should not be placed onto dunes. You may also drop off branches at the Recycling Drop-Off Center. No grass or root balls. UNTIED BRANCHES WILL NOT BE PICKED UP. NO BRANCHES IN PLASTIC BAGS. ## BATTERIES

- **Recycle rechargeable batteries.** A list of locations is available at the Municipal Building and on the website. The Ocean County Southern Recycling Center also accepts rechargeable batteries, and is the only local drop-off location for button batteries. 379 Haywood Road, Manahawkin, (609) 978-0913. See list of recyclers on LBT website.
- **Alkaline (single-use),** non-rechargeable, non-hazardous dry-cell batteries (AAA, AA, C, D, & 9-volt) should be thrown away in the regular trash.

Since 2017 with the help of participating area restaurants the Shell Recycling Program recovered over 32,000 bushels of shell. The growing number of local oyster farms in our bay with the @ barnegatoystercollective and our local restaurant recyclers has enabled this program to grow since its launch. This program and many other oyster restoration programs will continue building reefs with the hope that we can revive our oyster reef ecosystem.

One oyster can filter over 50 gallons of water a day.

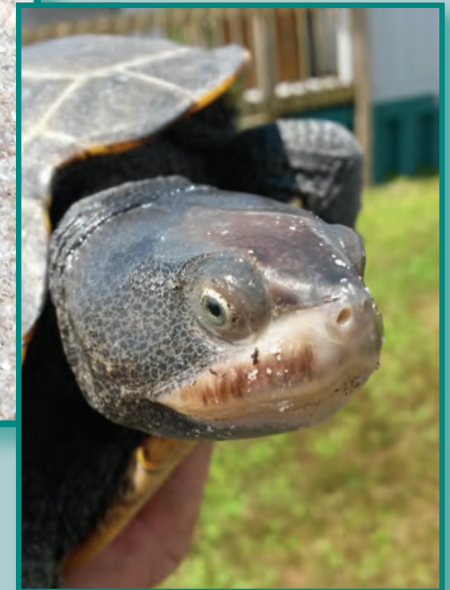

Diamondback terrapins are a species of turtles that live exclusively in salt marsh systems throughout the East and Gulf Coasts of the United States. Along Long Beach Island the salt marsh habitat offers terrapins food items such as snails, crabs and other prey items that are part of their diets. There are also areas where female terrapins nest including shoreline areas and properties.

Nesting season is from early June through late July with an incubation of approximately 60 or more days until the developing hatchlings emerge. Be aware of turtles crossing in communities on the island near wetland areas during this season!!

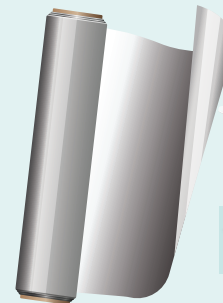

## Water Restriction Guidelines

In effect June 1 - September 30



Through our continuing effort to conserve water, Long Beach Township allows residential and commercial watering only according to alternating odd/even address numbers and calendar days:



- Addresses with EVEN numbers may irrigate on EVEN calendar days, as needed.
- Addresses with ODD numbers may irrigate on ODD calendar days, as needed.



Automatic sprinkling systems shall be operated only between 5:00 a.m. and 8:00 a.m. every other day.



Handheld hoses must be 3/4" diameter or less and can be used between 7:00 p.m. to 10:00 a.m. according to the odd/even schedule.

*No watering during rain*

Limit excessive watering so as not to cause run off into streets and driveway aprons; however, food establishments shall be permitted to wash down sidewalks, decks, garage aprons and the like.



**Emergency conditions may warrant additional restrictions.**

The above water conservation restrictions are enforced by Municipal ordinance No. 10-44c as mandated by the state of New Jersey





# Solutions to Stormwater Pollution

## Easy Things You Can Do Every Day To Protect Our Water

### A Guide to Healthy Habits for Cleaner Water

Pollution on streets, parking lots and lawns is washed by rain into storm drains, then directly to our drinking water supplies and the ocean and lakes our children play in. Fertilizer, oil, pesticides, detergents, pet waste, grass clippings: You name it and it ends up in our water.

Stormwater pollution is one of New Jersey's greatest threats to clean and plentiful water, and that's why we're all doing something about it.

By sharing the responsibility and making small, easy changes in our daily lives, we can keep common pollutants out of stormwater. It all adds up to cleaner water, and it saves the high cost of cleaning up once it's dirty.

As part of New Jersey's initiative to keep our water clean and plentiful and to meet federal requirements, many municipalities and other public agencies including colleges and military bases must adopt ordinances or other rules prohibiting various activities that contribute to stormwater pollution. Breaking these rules can result in fines or other penalties.



**As a resident, business, or other member of the New Jersey community, it is important to know these easy things you can do every day to protect our water.**

### Limit your use of fertilizers and pesticides

- Do a soil test to see if you need a fertilizer.
- Do not apply fertilizers if heavy rain is predicted.
- Look into alternatives for pesticides.
- Maintain a small lawn and keep the rest of your property or yard in a natural state with trees and other native vegetation that requires little or no fertilizer.
- If you use fertilizers and pesticides, follow the instructions on the label on how to correctly apply it.



Make sure you properly store or discard any unused portions.

### Properly use and dispose of hazardous products

- Hazardous products include some household or commercial cleaning products, lawn and garden care products, motor oil, antifreeze, and paints.
- Do not pour any hazardous products down a storm drain because storm drains are usually connected to local waterbodies and the water is not treated.

- If you have hazardous products in your home or workplace, make sure you store or dispose of them properly. Read the label for guidance.

- Use natural or less toxic alternatives when possible.

- Recycle used motor oil.

- Contact your municipality, county or facility management office for the locations of hazardous-waste disposal facilities.



### Keep pollution out of storm drains

- Municipalities and many other public agencies are required to mark certain storm drain inlets with messages reminding people that storm drains are connected to local waterbodies.

- Do not let sewage or other wastes flow into a stormwater system.

### Clean up after your pet

- Many municipalities and public agencies must enact and enforce local pet-waste rules.

- An example is requiring pet owners or their keepers to pick up and properly dispose of pet waste dropped on public or other people's property.

- Make sure you know your town's or agency's requirements and comply with them. It's the law. And remember to:

- Use newspaper, bags or pooper-scoopers to pick up wastes.

- Dispose of the wrapped pet waste in the trash or un-wrapped in a toilet.

- Never discard pet waste in a storm drain.

### Don't feed wildlife

- Do not feed wildlife, such as ducks and geese, in public areas.

- Many municipalities and other public agencies must enact and enforce a rule that prohibits wildlife feeding in these areas.



### Don't litter

- Place litter in trash receptacles.

- Recycle. Recycle. Recycle.

- Participate in community cleanups.

### Dispose of yard waste properly

- Keep leaves and grass out of storm drains.

- If your municipality or agency has yard waste collection rules, follow them.

- Use leaves and grass clippings as a resource for compost.

- Use a mulching mower that recycles grass clippings into the lawn.

This year we received 683 bundles of dune grass plugs (10 plugs in a bundle) from Ocean County Parks. This dune grass was made available to our homeowners and residents for planting. The dune grass is also planted by scouts, environmental groups, and other community organizations.

The county initiated the program in the 1990s following severe storms in the fall and early winter months that resulted in the weakening of the dunes. The amount of plants distributed is calculated by the coastal frontage in each town.

The Marine Academy of Technology & Environmental Science (MATES) Oceanography class planted dune grass plugs in Brant Beach in November.

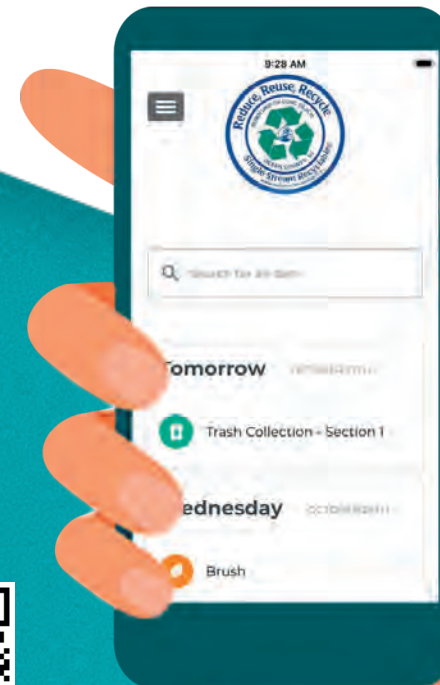

**This is the 13th year of our Long Beach Township Recycling/Trash Calendar. We hope it is useful and we appreciate our residents participating in the recycling program.**

**The first half of 2022 provided the first payout to the towns in 3 years through the Ocean County Recycling Revenue Sharing Program. Since the equipment improvements at the Recycling Materials Processing Facility machinery over the last 2 years, the County has a more marketable end product. It is important as ever to continue recycling as the landfill prices continue to increase.**

**Last year, the State banned the use of plastic and paper bags for carry out items at most stores. However, the State recently amended the regulation to allow the option of using paper bags for grocery delivery and curbside pickup.**

**Remember the 3r's- Reduce consumption, Reuse what you can and Recycle only what is acceptable by the County.**
