AN ORDINANCE AMENDING AN ORDINANCE ENTITLED, "CODE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF LONG BEACH, COUNTY OF OCEAN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, (1997)" IN CHAPTER 51, WHICH PERTAINS TO BEACHES, AND CHAPTER 135, WHICH PERTAINS TO PEACE AND ORDER

STATEMENT OF PURPOSE

This Ordinance amends Chapter 53 to revise and add regulations relating to beach equipment and accessories and amend Chapter 135 to revise the regulations relating to juvenile curfew.

SECTION I

§51-18R is repealed and replaced and X is added as follows in alphabetical order.

- R. The installation, erection, and/or placement of any beach umbrella between the hours of 7:00 p.m. and 9:00 a.m.
- X. The setting up, installation, erection, and/or placement of any beach chairs, towels, or any other beach supplies, equipment, and/or accessories between the hours of 7:00 p.m. and 9:00 a.m. without the owner and/or end user of the aforesaid present. No unattended beach supplies, equipment, and/or accessories shall be placed on the beach during the aforesaid hours which has the effect of reserving public beach space for persons not present at the time of installation, erection, and/or placement to attend to and use such.

SECTION II

§135-6B, C, and D are repealed and replaced with the following.

- B. Except as otherwise provided herein, juveniles shall not be permitted on any beach after 9:00 p.m. and until 5:00 a.m. and in any public place after 10:00 p.m. and until 5:00 a.m. the following day.
 - (1) Juveniles 14 through 17 years of age may travel to and from a business or occupation which the laws authorize a juvenile to perform.
 - (2) All juveniles may engage in errands involving medical emergencies and cultural, educational, and social events sponsored by religious or community-based organizations during curfew hours.
 - (3) Juveniles are permitted outside on the beach and in any public areas during the prohibited times provided they are accompanied by their parent or legal guardian.
 - (4) Juveniles may remain outside past curfew to engage in interstate travel in any means of transportation through, either beginning, throughout, or terminating in the Township.
 - (5) Juveniles may remain outside past curfew on a sidewalk and/or another property such as but not limited to a next-door neighbor directly abutting or adjacent a place where the juvenile resides with a parent or legal guardian until the property owner or a member of the general public complains of the juvenile's presence during curfew hours to the local law enforcement department.
- C. It shall be unlawful for any parent or legal guardian to knowingly allow an unaccompanied juvenile to violate the curfew regulations. A parent or legal guardian commits an offense if they knowingly permit, allow, and/or encourage, or by insufficient control of the juvenile allow, the juvenile to remain in or upon any public place, to remain in any motor vehicle operating or parked therein or thereon, and/or to remain in or upon the premises of any establishment during curfew hours.
- D. Any adult who violates a provision of this Section is guilty of a separate offense for each day, or part of a day, during which the violation is committed, continued, or permitted.

- E. It shall be unlawful for a person who is the owner or driver of any motor vehicle to knowingly permit, allow, or encourage a violation of this Section.
- F. It shall be unlawful for the operator of any establishment, or for any person who is an employee thereof, to knowingly permit, allow, or encourage a juvenile to remain upon the premises of the establishment during curfew hours.
- G. It shall be unlawful for any person, including any juvenile, to give a false name, address, or telephone number to any officer investigating a possible violation of this Section.
- H. Any juvenile violating this Section shall be provided at least one (1) curbside warning by a law enforcement officer and an opportunity for the juvenile to leave the public place, the motor vehicle operating or parked therein or thereon, and/or in or upon the premises of any establishment before the law enforcement officer issues a stationhouse adjustment to the juvenile. After the second curbside warning, or if the juvenile refuses to leave after a curbside warning, the juvenile shall be subject to having a stationhouse adjustment and the juvenile's parent, legal guardian, or caretaker called to develop an appropriate resolution.
 - (1) If a juvenile refuses to give a law enforcement officer his or her name and address, refuses to give the name and address of his or her parent(s), legal guardian(s), or caretaker(s), or if no parent, legal guardian, or caretaker can be located prior to the end of the applicable curfew hours, or if located, no parent, legal guardian, or caretaker appears to accept custody of the juvenile, the law enforcement officer shall be empowered to provide a stationhouse adjustment to the juvenile who shall be taken to a temporary care facility for a period not to exceed the remainder of the curfew hours to be dealt with in the manner and pursuant to such procedures as required by law so that the juvenile's parent, legal guardian, or caretaker may retrieve the juvenile.

SECTION III

All ordinances, or parts of ordinances, inconsistent with this ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.

SECTION IV

If any word, phrase, clause, section, or provision of this ordinance shall be found by any Court of competent jurisdiction to be unenforceable, illegal, or unconstitutional, such word, phrase, clause, section, or provision shall be severable from the balance of the ordinance and the remainder of the ordinance shall remain in full force and effect.


Effective date.
